- ▶ HELP IMPROVE NONPROFIT WAGES SAN FRANCISCO
HSN has been partnering with the City Controller's Office, City departments, and other nonprofit stakeholders to address the key issues facing nonprofits who contract with the City. The first phase of the Nonprofit Policy Group's work culminated in a report on nonprofit wage pressures that set the stage for this year's 5% COLA and 2.5% cost-of-doing-business increase in this year's budget.

The results of this survey will inform policy solutions to nonprofit sustainability concerns, including recommendations for the FY24 budget cycle and beyond.

API COUNCIL RECAP

On October 17th, the API Council had its monthly general meeting and was joined by State Senator Scott Wiener.

The API Council also took positions on ballot measures that will be on the November ballot.

Citywide ballot measures results:

- YES: Prop L - Transportation Sales Tax Measure
- YES: Prop O - CCSF Parcel Tax

Statewide ballot measures results:

- YES: Prop 1 - Constitutional Right to Reproductive Freedom
- NO POSITION: Prop 26 - Legalize Sports Betting on American Indian Lands Initiative
- NO: Prop 27 - Legalize Sports Betting and Revenue for Homelessness Prevention Fund Initiative
